HALLELUJAH CHORUS (from Handel's "Messiah")



(Look at that wig on Handel!)

"Hallelujah Chorus" is from a larger composition called "Messiah," written by **Baroque** composer **George Frideric Handel**.

"Messiah" is an **oratorio**—a large-scale composition written for an orchestra, choir, and solo singers. Unlike opera, there are no props or costumes, just lots of awesome singing.

The popular "O Holy Night" is a French carol, also known as "Cantique de Noël." It has been recorded by many famous singers, including Josh Groban, Celine Dion, Martina McBride, and Mariah Carey.

The **Arena Chapel** is a small church in Padua, **Italy**. It features a series of **frescoes** (paintings on plaster) that show the "Life of the Virgin" and the "Life of Christ."

The frescoes were painted by Early Renaissance artist **Giotto** around 1305. They are considered to be Giotto's masterpiece!

This is a 360-degree video; click/tap and DRAG the screen for a tour of Giotto's Arena Chapel!





The City of Bethlehem

Bethlehem is known as the birthplace of Jesus. It was destroyed during the second century, but was rebuilt at the direction of Empress Helena, the mother of Constantine the Great. Helena also had the **Church of the Nativity** built (pictured here).

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


WARM-UP




PRO TIP:
Before playing in swing rhythm, count 2 measures out loud!

Play this **E minor** 5-finger pattern with **swing 8th notes!** ("LONG-short")



Tap slowly, hands together. Count with (regular) **straight 8th notes**. Then, tap hands together while counting with **swing 8th notes**. Be sure to do a two-measure count-off out loud before starting!



SAMPLE

CREATE

Improvise using a chord pattern from the piece.


(From LH measures 9–10, etc.)



- · Play the measures above, which form an **E minor chord**.
- Then, move down to play the pattern on a **D major chord**.
- · Then, move down again to play the pattern on a C major chord.
