

#### **Adjusting MP3 Tempos (Speed)**

"Carnival of the Animals" is a suite (or set) of 14 pieces by the French composer Camille Saint-Saëns. Among these pieces, the most famous is "The Swan," written for piano and cello.

As you listen to the performance below, notice that the cello plays a smooth (legato) melody, like a swan gliding on a lake.



# Student EXPLORATIONS, cont. THE SWAN





Experiment with different chords, then **write** your chord choices in the 8 blank spaces below. You can repeat chords or use all different ones.

🚺 Play your creation! Be sure to hold the pedal, and change for each new chord.

Major and Minor Chords:	
<b>C</b> = C E G	<b>Dm</b> = D F A
<b>F</b> = F A C	<b>Em</b> = E G B
<b>G</b> = G B D	<b>Am</b> = A C E
