



WARM-UP

Tap **hands separately** while counting out loud.
Then, tap **hands together** while counting out loud.



Write-in the counts.

Then, tap while counting out loud.



DISCOVER

In measures 1–7, the RH notes are all which interval?



- **Measure 25** uses three different notes: C, E, and G. Write the note names in the music at measure 25. Then, circle the notes to be played by the RH.
- The second-to-last measure has a roll:



Play the notes of the chord one-at-a-time **quickly**, from bottom to top, starting with the LH.

Play the last two measures of the piece!

Turn the page for the piece itself!




Experiment with different chords, then **write** your chord choices in the 8 blank spaces below. You can repeat chords or use all different ones.
