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
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
PLAYING WITH A METRONOME



A **METRONOME** plays **clicks** at different tempos. It can be an app, an electronic device, or even one of those old-timey wooden boxes with a metal arm that swings back and forth. (Your teacher might have one to show you.)

Playing with a metronome helps you learn how to **play with a steady beat**. With the metronome set at a moderately slow tempo, play the exercises **hands separately** at first.


As you play, listen closely to the metronome as it clicks on each beat.








MAJOR TRIADS




Db, **Eb**, and **Ab** major triads have **1 white key in the middle**. On the keyboard, each chord forms a "**V**" **shape**. Play these V-shaped triads.



Gb and Bb major triads are unique.

Notice that Gb major forms a straight line on the black keys. Play these triads.



PLAYING MINOR TRIADS STARTING ON BLACK KEYS

1. Play all of the black-key minor triads **in a row with your right hand**:




ROOT POSITION


So far, you've learned triads in **ROOT POSITION**, in which the chord's letter name is on the <u>bottom</u>.




1ST INVERSION

An **INVERSION** is a chord that has its notes arranged in a different order. To play a **1ST INVERSION** chord, move the bottom note to the top:






2. From root position, move the top note to bottom.
